

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR OUTSTANDING POTENTIAL

Scholarships provide prospective students who have outstanding potential with £800 to support with essential course costs; textbooks and equipment, fund overseas travel or pay for research opportunities or university tuition fees.

Eligibility

You must:

- Be between 16-18 years old on 1 September in the year you begin College
- Be Eligible for free education at the College
- Have a minimum of 6 GCSE grades at A or A* or a BTEC Distinction qualification from one sitting
- Be able to meet the specific criteria laid down by the scholarships.

Student commitment to the Scholarship

- You must apply direct to Terry Horner, Head of Learning and Standards for Learner Attainment for a scholarship
- You will receive equal payments of your scholarship over a two year period. Each scholarship is worth £800, payable in 2 equal payments over the two years
- At the Celebration of Achievement evening in December you may be asked to give a brief talk to assembled guests, students and parents on how you have used the scholarship money
- You must demonstrate commitment to your studies at the College. If you do not make progress or you decide to leave, the Head of Learning and Standards for Learner Attainment reserves the right not to recommend the second payment
- If you leave the College prior to December in Year One you must return the first payment of the scholarship in full.

Process for application

- If you are predicted 6 or more GCSEs at A and A* (including BTEC distinction), you can apply for a scholarship from October
- You must have completed an interview and been offered a place at the College
- You should write a letter of no more than 300 words to Terry Horner, Head of Learning and Standards for Learner Attainment, which includes the course programme you have applied for at the College; the subjects at which you have excelled at and enjoyed whilst at school and your future plans for university and your career
- The deadline for applications is 31 August in the year of entry to the College.
- You will be sent an acknowledgement letter confirming receipt of your application
- In September you will receive a letter in the post from the Director of Farnham Sixth Form College confirming your scholarship subject to achieving the grades and enrolling at the College
- Successful students will receive the first payment of their scholarship by the end of September.
